

GOLF COURSE POLICIES AND GUIDELINES

Use of Golf Course is Restricted to the Following:

1. Clay Center Country Club golfing members and their guests. Guest must pay green fees, be accompanied by a golfing member and sign the guest book.
2. Associate members of the Clay Center Country Club. Associate members must pay green fees.
3. Members of reciprocal clubs. Reciprocal members must show proof of membership and pay green fees.
4. No child will be permitted to play golf on weekends or holidays unless accompanied by a golfing adult, or until he/she has reached sixteen years of age.

GREEN FEES

Weekdays: **\$20 per person**

Weekends and Holidays: **\$25**

All guests of golfing members must be accompanied by an adult golfing member. A house guest playing with an adult golfing member receives a \$5 discount on green fees. Members must play with their guests and pay, register and display the tag of the guest at all times. No exceptions will be allowed unless the Golf and Social Committee is contacted and special exemptions are agreed upon prior to play. Any golfing member may bring an out-of-county guest, age 16 and under, and pay half price green fees and must be accompanied by an adult golfing member. Children, age 12 and under, will pay half price green fees and must be accompanied by an adult golfing member.

CART HOUSE RENTAL

Only golfing members may rent cart stalls in the upper cart shed.

Cart stalls are not transferable from one membership to another. If a member who is renting a cart stall does not have use for the stall to store their cart, they should relinquish the stall to the club and any amount of unused rent will be refunded to them. It is important that this be observed by all members. If the board of directors determines that a member is violating this rule, the cart stall will be assigned to the next person on the waiting list. Remember, the cart stalls are **NOT TRANSFERABLE**.

Only an individual (and or spouse) with his/her name on a cart stall is the sole tenant. The only way to obtain rental of any cart stall is through the board approved rotation. Cart stall assignments are given by the board in the following manner. Members start in the south half of the cart house down the hill, and from there to the cart house up the hill to the basement level, and then to the upper level. If you have any questions or would like to rent a stall, call the accounting office. There will be yearly trail fees for all carts not housed on our grounds.

Associate Members may rent a cart stall in the south end of the lower cart shed.

LOCKER ROOM FACILITIES

Locker room facilities for men and women are on the lower level of the Country Club. Golfing members are issued key cards to access that portion of the building when the rest of the facility is closed. To discuss locker rental or waiting list situations, contact the accounting office.

TWO-DAY TOURNAMENTS

The course will be closed the entire first day of the tournament and will not be reopened until tournament completion on the second day. On a typical Saturday and Sunday tournament, a member that is not participating in the event must wait until the course is opened Sunday evening following completion of the event.

GOLF COURSE CARE, ETIQUETTE AND RULES

1. All golfers must wear shirts. (See Dress Code)
2. Only golf or tennis type shoes are acceptable.
3. Do not go barefoot on the course. Chemicals on the fairways and greens could be dangerous to your health. For the same reason, it is not advisable to smoke a cigarette after laying it on the green while putting.
4. Don't take drinks onto the green.
5. Each player must play with an individual set of clubs.
6. No golf carts, pull carts or bags should be taken onto greens, fringes or slopes.
7. Stay on cart paths where possible. Some areas are marked "No Carts." If a golfer has health problems which make it difficult to walk to the ball, the golf course superintendent will provide a sticker for the cart which allows the golfer to drive in these areas.
8. Drive golf carts no closer than 30' to the green.
9. Replace divots on the tee box and fairways and repair ball marks on the greens.
10. Play without delay. Leave the green immediately after putting. You can record your scores while waiting to tee off on the next hole.
11. Let faster groups play through.
12. Don't drop clubs or the flag stick on the green.
13. Play holes in sequence, not at random.
14. Play only one ball. Practicing on the course is not allowed. Use the practice area only for this purpose. Do not practice putting or chipping on greens or fairways.
15. Maximum allowable group size is a fivesome.
16. Cart Limit - Two per foursome. Three per fivesome.
17. Read and abide by rules and courtesies of golf as printed on the score cards.
18. Golf Cart drivers must be 16 years old or older to drive anywhere on the grounds of the Clay Center Country Club even if accompanied by an adult.

DRESS CODE

The following dress code has been adopted by the Clay Center Country Club Operating Board. Golfers on the course (members and your guests) must wear attire appropriate for a private country club.

Required attire for men are shirts with collars. For example: polo style, turtleneck, mock neck, mandarin or any shirt exhibiting a collar is appropriate. No sleeveless shirts are permitted for men.

Required attire for women include shirts with collars or any appropriate style golf shirts and tops. Women may wear sleeveless shirts; however, sleeveless shirts must have a collar.

Shorts are appropriate attire if they are finger tip length, usually mid to low thigh. (Holding arms down to your side and where your finger tips hit is the appropriate length.) Short shorts, cut-offs or any apparel exhibiting holes or excessive wear will not be allowed. Common everyday t-shirts are not considered golf course attire. Outerwear such as sweatshirts, v-necks, pullovers and rain gear are acceptable and collars are not necessary on these items.

Children under the age of 18 are exempt from the above policy, but are expected to wear appropriate attire. The following dress code will apply to everyone including children. Shirts or apparel with alcohol and tobacco ads or slogans or with any inappropriate comments are not acceptable for anyone. Tank tops, halter tops or strapless tops are not permitted on anyone. We are a family country club and therefore this type of attire is not appropriate and will not be tolerated.

On the golf course only soft spike golf shoes or tennis type shoes are acceptable. Do not go barefoot. Chemicals used on the course could be dangerous to your health.

Golfers may wear caps into all areas of the clubhouse with the exception of the formal dining room.

The present dress code for the dining room and lounge is appropriate casual wear. The dining room does not currently have a regulation requiring sport coats or neckties, but again, please dress appropriately for dining. Shorts are acceptable if they follow the golf course guidelines. Caps and visors are not allowed in the dining room at any time.
